A while back I received a letter from Shirlie Chaney of LaVergne, Tennessee. She was searching for more information on the parents of her grandmother Nannie Taylor Smith. Nannie was the daughter of George Washington Taylor and Elizabeth Ingram. Shirlie knew that George had fought for the Confederate Army during the war between the States. She also believed that he had died fairly young as she had only found his widow and young daughter, Nannie, on the 1880 census of Gallation County, Illinois.

Nannie was born in southern Illinois, the stomping grounds of Bully John Taylor's brothers, Isaac, Lewis, and Joshua, and their children. It was also the home of Bully John's daughter. Sarah and her second husband, John Winfrey, and Bully John's son Wilse, who had walked from Tennessee in a response to some marauding night riders.

In attempting to answer Shirlie's letter I tried putting on my thinking cap and the story of Wilse and his brother came back to me. From what Roy Taylor told us we had learned that Wilse and one of his brothers had had an argument while chopping wood and that Wilse had stomped off to enlist in the Union Army while his brother went the other direction and enlisted in the Confederate Army. Roy never told us the name of the brother. In checking records of Bully John's family I found that his son Barney had served for the North and George served for the South. George also left Indian Creek after the Civil War and no one in DeKalb knew what had happened to him.

In answering Shirlie's letter I mentioned that after Wilse had gone to Illinois, his wife followed driving a wagon with a one-eyed horse and a blind mule -- or was it a one-eyed mule and a blind horse? I can't remember. Regardless she had heard and knew the story also and since all the dates were in the right time frame she decided our George W. Taylor had to be her George Washington Taylor.

Shirlie Chaney was without a doubt one of the happiest and most excited people I've ever talked to about finding her roots. She is hoping to returen to Gallation County, Illinois, in an attempt to find George's grave which she feels may probably be in Elizabethtown where her grandmother lived for a time before moving to Mt. Vernon, Illinois.

Shirlie has since written a book on her ancestors including what she has learned concerning her great grandfather. The following information is taken in part from Shirlie's research and writings.

"George Washington Taylor served in the Civil War for the southern forces in Captain Robert Cantrell's company, the Twenty-Third Regiment, Confederate Infantry, according to Will T. Hale in his HISTORY OF DEKALB COUNTY, reprinted in 1969, by the Ben Lomond Press, McMinnville, Tennessee. George was a

private and served with several of his Smithville community neighbors.

"George's service records show some interesting events, although they were less than illustrious. Still, they show he enlisted in the 23rd Tennessee Infantry on July 19, 1861, and that he was 18 years old. In reality, he was only about 16 and had lied about his age. He enlisted for a period of 12 months at Camp Anderson by Capt. J. L. Scudder (this became Capt. Cantrell's Co.) By August 31, 1862, after serving his 12 months, the record showed he drew his bounty and was sent off with the "barefooted" squad. By Nov. and Dec. he then was listed as absent with leave on furlough. He could never have returned to his outfit during this time which was involved in the Battle of Stones River (Murfreesboro) which occurred Dec. 29, 1862 - Jan. 3, 1863. Hale's History of DeKalb County reported on page 208 the following action in the area where there were skirmishes between Confederate and Union groups:

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Alexandria - Feb. 3 -5, 1863

Smithville - June 4 - 5, 1863

Snow's Hill - Apr. 2 - 6; June 4, 1863

Liberty - Jan. 21 - 22; Feb. 17 - 20; Mar. 19;

Apr. 2 - 88; May 12 - 16; June 12, 1863

Salem - Mar. 21; May 20, 1863

Salem Pike - June 12, 1863
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"Archive records show that George did not return by Feb. and was listed as deserted. Since Rosecrans Union Army wintered in Murfreesboro at the site of the present Old Fort Park, George couldn't have gotten back without being captured or getting killed. Besides he had alread served his 12 months and more."

The following contains Shirlie's findings compared to the story of Wilse and George's argument while chopping wood.

"It is the dates that alter the situation for both George and Wilse. George enlisted in July of 1861 and was taken prisoner in August of 1863. Wilse enlisted on November 10, 1863, joining C Company, 5th Regiment of the Tennessee Cavalry. He gave his birthdate as June 4, 1844. He was discharged August 14, 1865. (While the surrender at Appomattox was April, 1865, some troops in the western portion of the south did not stop at that time, such as Bedford Forrest's Troops.)

"George was captured as a prisoner in DeKalb County on August 15, 1863, and was sent to a military prison in Louisville. Time came for an exchange of prisoners and George was included in this exchange. He did not wish to be exchanged and did not go. He stated to his captors that he was convinced he had been wrong and wished to be loyal. He had been transferred to Camp Chase in Ohio and discovered he could enlist in the U. S. Frontier Service and did so with his records showing his enlistment in this service on January 14, 1864. He entered the Frontier Service and was transferred to Rock Island, Illinois."

After he was mustered out of service George married Elizabeth Ingram somewhere in southern Illinois in either late 1866 or early 1867. Their only child, Nannie, was born February 25, 1868. Elizabeth also had an older child, a son, William Ingram.

Shirlie continues: "Nannie Taylor, my grandmother had been born in Hardin County, Illinois, near old Shawneetown which is in The Hardin County records were destroyed by Gallatin County. fire and the marriage record of George Taylor and Elizabeth George was engaged in commercial Ingram is not available. fishing along the Ohio River of the tri-state area of Illinois. Kentucky, and Indiana. Nannie moved with her parents or perhaps just her mother to Hovey, Indiana, where Nannie was baptized at the Greathouse Methodist Church. There is now a state park south of Hovey on the highway going to the river. In 1884, Nannie married William H. Smith (originally Hockersmith). The couple lived in the Mt. Vernon, Indiana, area where six of their ten childern were born. Later, they moved to Mt. Vernon, Illinois, (And yes, there is both a Mt. Vernon in Indiana and in Illinois) where George's brother Wilse and their Taylor uncles had settled. Two more of Nannie's children, Walter and Fred, were born at The last two children. Omaha, Illinios, in Gallatin County. Marie and Franklin Taylor Smith were born in Mt. Vernon, Illinois."

George and his family are found on the 1870 Hardin County, IL census. Apparently George died during the 1870's as only his wife and their daughter are found on the 1880 Posey County, IL, census nor was his stepson, William Ingram found on this census. He drowned in Saline Creek when he was about nine years old. No death records have been found of either George Washington Taylor or young William.

Once again I must return to William Taylor, Sr 's son Samuel Taylor. Sr. For me he has been the most elusive of the brothers - with the exception of George who has been totally invisable since 1814. My husband, Harve, has always referred to the Taylors as being 'fiddle-footed' and I guess Sam would rank as number one in this department. Many of the Taylors did alot of moving, both in the early days and even today. However they did leave a trail we could follow, but not Sam. will-o-the-whisp.

It seems he must never have wanted his name written down on any records. When the census was taken he was off in another state so all we found were his wife and his children. squatted on the land he settled on or lived with some of his children who did own land in various places. If one of his sons hadn't been underage when he wanted to get married, we would probably never even found out what Sam's name actually was. Thank goodness he had to give written permission for his son John to marry and sign the consent form.

If indeed we have found all of his children, it appears that none of them took after Sam in his 'fiddle-footed' ways. In fact none of them even named any of their children after him.

We have discovered some of the same type of traits that Sam seemed to posses in some later day Taylors. And the only way we have ever been able to keep track of them was through various Someone usually knew where their father. brother, or husband was and kept the rest informed. family members.

Shortly after the 1880 census was taken. Milton Taylor's daughter, Malinda Sluder and her family left for Florida. Peer sent me a copy of a letter she sent back to her parents in Illinois. Herb also deciphered it for us. He said, 'I retained all the mispellings, run-on sentences etc. to maintain the flavor as much as possible. I thought it was interesting that she mentioned riding the stage.

Here is a copy of what Herb sent:

letter is from Malinda (Taylor) Sluder to her father and mother, Milton Asbury Taylor and Amanda M. Taylor, wife by second marriage.

Brookville is actually Brooksville in Hernando County, Florida, which is located on the east side of Florida about 40 miles north of Tampa.

`The Maud in the letter is her daughter who was about 7 at the time. Lump is probably her husband Columbus.

`Dear father and mother with pleasure I write you a few . This leaves us all with colds we got here safe after Traveling all weeke over mountains through tunnels besides. some butiful cities we got to gainsville Thursday and Stop overnight friday morning taking train for wildwood arrived their five in the evening taking Stage for Brookville traveled all friday night got to Mr. Wichersham Saturday about daylight and stoped with them untill monday after noon we got board with a small family they have three children they are perticular to learn their manners so maud she says yes mam and no mam I asked her what I should wirte for her She said tell gramma poor little maud Sends her some moss we will go to housekeeping next weeke. Lump is at work and has Bin ever sens he come here ever thing green here we sit in the room with the doors and windows open and no fire I went up town yesterday and carried a umbiriler to keep the sun off we have frost three morning here it hit the gardens the sellers grumble more then you would about four feet snow the oranges trees are full I saw bananas and almost ever thing that grows here. I will write more abourt florida at another time tell Mary and Hi To write me I want to know all the news our fright haint came yet we look evry day for

`I quess i have wrote enough So write soon yours truly

`Malinda Sluder'

The above mentioned Mary was her sister, Mary Taylor Bridges and Hi her brother Hirum.

Herb did not mention if they remained in Florida or eventually returned to the Indiana-Illinois area.

This short family tree of William Taylor, Jr. differs considerably from others that I have printed. The reason is that I have had the privilege of seeing a photocopy of a few pages from a Bible that once belonged to William Taylor, Jr. in which he recorded the births of his children. The manner in which William, Jr. recorded these births is somewhat unique since he used the margins and spaces within the printed text rather than writing them all on a single blank page. It is rather hard to decipher much of the writing due to a poor type of photocopy plus the blurring of the ink that was used. In one place William, Jr. wrote the following:

"January the 5 day 1801 Nancy _____? ___ was born This is her age wrote by me William Taylor Jr."

Because of this I believe that it was William. Jr. who did all the writing except on one blank page which appeared to be a practice page. There was more than one person's handwriting there. That page contained the following plus his son, Barden's birth.

"John Terrell was born 1796 November the 28 Day 1796" (This was Jermiah Terrell's youngest son)

"Amondine Shellet" (could she be John Terrell's wife?)

"Jim Jordon" (son-in-law of Jeremiah Terrell)

"I promise to pay or caus (sic) to be paid unto Barnat Decker the just and full sum of twenty dollars it being for value received of him"

"A copy plate writen Bare light your pen give gold or silver for _____?___"

The remainder of the material that I was able to read and was found on various pages throughout the Bible is as follows:

"William, Jr. was born September the 7th day of 1778"

"Jesse Taylor was born November 27 day in the year 1802"

"Martha Taylor was born on May 5 in the year 1804"

"William Taylor was born on September the first day in the 1805"

"Son Barden Taylor was born September 6 day in the year 1808"

"William and John was born July 20 in the year 1817"

"Alclan(?) Jordon was born in the year of our lord ____?____"

There was no mention of William, Jr.'s daughter, Rachel, in the pages that I received. We have been lead to believe that Rachel Terrell Taylor may have died giving birth to young Rachel and if this is true it is possible William, Jr. never did get her birth recorded or it simply could be on a page that I did not receive. Since there was no mention of Jeremiah W. Taylor either, I am of the opinion that he was the twin named William. Also William, Jr. had another son named William with his first wife, Rachel. The twins' mother was Susannah Terrell, his second wife. Most of William's sons used either a middle intial or middle name in any legal transactions throughout their lives, although no middle names were recorded in the Bible record.

I enjoyed a letter I received from Rebecca Guidroz, 1050 West Beach Drive, Panama City, FL 32401. In it she complained of not remembering what her grandmother had told her years ago about the Taylor family.

"My brother and I loved to tease our precious grandmother when she would mention Cousin So-and-So. or old Uncle Benjamin. or many other relatives. We asked her if she was related to everyone in Elbert County/Wilkes/Franklin, GA and she would just smile and reply: `Why certainly, I am - and you two also.' What an opportunity wasted.

"I recently found some new information on Jeremiah Terrell. whom I have futiley researched for years. Also on Louisa Walton.

his wife."

In another letter she wrote the following:

"Mr. Wansley said my uncle, John C. Taylor, son of Charles Pinckney Taylor and Sarah Elizabeth Brown, was found dead in a coal yard. Mr. Wansley was definitely mistaken with this bit of his information. My Uncle John died October 22, 1927, at the home of his parents on Elm Street in Elberton, GA. He had a heart attack and died in the front yard. My brother Rea who was 16 at the time was with my grandparents recuperating from polio, which he caught while visiting them the latter part of the summer. My brother was horrified to read this about our uncle, especially when he was there. Mr. Wansley probably just mixed up

his 'recalls'." Rebecca is the daughter of Jessie May Taylor and Rea Steele. "Rea was spelled Rae in Trail and John C. was Jonathan. Jessie was the daughter of Charles P. Taylor, son of the reprobate Barden R. Taylor, the Taylor no one had a kind word to say about. He, an acknowledged atheist, would turn over in his grave if he but knew the many devoted Baptist descendants he left, carrying on what he could not stop with his anvil!"

Cliff Hill, who is also a descendant of William Taylor, Jr. and very interested in the genealogy of their branch of the Taylors, has collected several obituaries that he will share with anyone interested in them. He sent a copy of a letter that was written during the Civil War. This letter was written to Jesse Walton Taylor by his son-in-law, Henley Smith, when he was in the Confederate army. There are a few phrases and words that I was not able to decipher. The spelling of the original has been copied.

Camp. 15th Geo. Regt. Feb. 2, 1865

I am going to do something that I never done Dear Father before. That is I am going to write or rather try to write you a I have nothing special or interesting to write more that I enjoy fine health. ____ (Next entire line unreadable)___ but to the contrary every thing is quite gloomy. The Army is all verry low spirited The Majority of the soldiers think we are gone up. I for one believe that our case is allmost hopeless unless providence prevails in our behalf. It appears that we are confronted on all sides with strong invadeing armies and we have but few men that is willing to depsute their passage to any point they choose to go. From all that I can learn from Georgia it appears that nealy all the malitia and the most of Hood's army have deserted and gone home. If that is the case and this army is the dependence to do all the fighting for the Confederacy I I don't think that I am very quickly to think we will loose. Dispond but I tell you my own pulse is lower now than they have ever bin before.. if every boddy would pitch in and fight that is able to fight and all the rest would try to rais something to the soldiers all would be well but to the disappointment of a faithful few that is not the case as are Bellies hungry. and We have some Commishiners gone to witnesses in the case.. Washington to try to settle our difficulty but our Congress warns us against putting any faith in their mission as their is no prospect whatever of peace. That the onley hope for peace is in steeddy endurance and hard fighting. The say we can't except the terms of peace that the Yankees offer. My private opinion is that we will be forced to except any terms that they see propper to offer us and that before long. We are living on verry short Rashions only draw three days Rashions at a time and it barely holds out for two days. We are often 24 hours without a bite to eat. We have just drew one days rashion of beef for three men and I can eat every bite of it myself at one meal. Bacon that we get for three days would not make more than two good meals. This

is the way we suffer for our country or in other words for Rich mens propperty. Our Congress and the newspapers informs the soldier and the world Generally that we are getting plenty of everything to eat. It is a-nough to make a man curse the day he was first called a Soldier. Some of the officers of our army are playing off nice tricks on their commanders. I have been noticeing some verry patriotic resilutions in the Richmond papers lately from different Brigades in our army differing verry much from the jeneral tone of the soldiers. Yesterday the mistery leaked out. a few patriotic officers of Laws Allabamina Brigade in our Division drew up some resilutions after this manner, that we the officiers and men of Laws Brigade do hereby resolve that we will stand by the administration and the confederate cause as long as their is a man left to weald a weapen in defense of southern independence (or something to that _____. They formed ___ Brigade ____ the resilutions and the men told that they had representsed any such meeting and they would not add their resilutions and they broke with a big row. Some of the men then drew up resilutions resolveing that they would not fight any longer and every man in one regiment assigned them. So I was told. I did not see it myself I must close tell Martha that I will write as soon as I can get some paper. I had this. Tell Frank to hurry back that he is three days behind time he will go before a General Court Marshal.

Henley Smith

Henly Smith was wounded in the head shortly after this letter was written. He lived for many years after this, but showed the effects of this head wound for the remainder of his life. Most of the following family tree is found on pages 400 and 401 of the Legends book. This contains some additional information on the family of Martha Decker Taylor and Henley Smith who was born April 5, 1832, in Anderson County, SC. They had 4 children: William, Laura, Virginia, and Lulu.

From the 'Flathead Courier', Thursday, June 26, 1946.

"Death claims W. W. Taylor -- Funeral arrangements for William W. Taylor, 81, are pending word from relatives as we go to press.

"Mr. Taylor was born in 1864 and spent a large portion of his life as an employee of the Northern Pacific railroad. He worked several years in Lake county and vicinity prior to his retirement, when he purched a place on Finley Point.

"Illness forced him to enter a Missoula hospital about a

month ago. His death occurred last Monday at noon.

"The body is at the Retz mortuary in Polson at this time. Mr. Taylor had no relatives in this vicinty."

From the `Flathead Courier', Thursday, July 4, 1946.

"Rites held for W. W. Taylor. -- Funeral rites for W. W. Taylor of Polson were conducted Monday afternoon at 2:30 at the Retz chapel with Rev. Edwin Dover officiating. The Masonic lodge was in charge of the service.

"Pallbearers were Gwen Neifert, Otto Marsh, George Harrell,

Max Lovinger, Roy Hubbard, and William Leader.

"Mr. Taylor was 81 years of age at the time of his death which occurred Monday, June 24, at a Missoula hospital. He had been living in Polson for some time following his retirement from the Northern Pacific railroad, where he had been an employee a

large portion of his life. He was born in Georgia in 1864 (on January 27th).

"During his time in this area, he lived on Finley Point.
"Survivors include two brothers and three sisters, all of whom reside in the Southern States."

on Highway 77 to Clark's Junction.

Turn right onto Highway 368, and go 9.6 miles, going 1.95 miles beyond the New Bethel Methodist Church, and .4 mile beyond the bridge ever Pickens Creek.

Turn right onto Road 230, and go .4 mile. You have some about 115 yards past the second of two oak trees close together on the left, and you have stopped where a rock about 18"x16"x10" has been left near the left side of the road. About 25 yards farther out Road 230, a little road goes to the left, but it will not help you this time.

Go into the pine forest on the left of Road 230, heading a little north of east along a little ridge and going toward an eak tree which can be seen from Road 230. That tree is about 140 yards from Road 230. It has two trunks and is on the first terrace.

Go on about 30 yards a little to the left to another oak tree, which is on the second terrace and also has two trunks.

Go on about 27 yards a little more to the left to two oak trees, one of which has five trunks. They are on the third terrace.

About 11 yards away, down slightly to the left, you will see a large patch of periwinkle. Two home made markers are under a tall elm, an oak, and some cedars. They are about eight feet apart. No letters were found.

A tall poplar tree is about 45 yards straight north from the oak tree that has five trunks. Under its low branches is an open well, partly covered by vines.

To the northeast from the well are two walnut trees, one of which is very large. Beyond the big walnut tree is a spring branch.

It is understood that Jesse Taylor and his wife, Decka, were buried here. There are some indications that there probably were other burials here.

Mr. Adlai Stowers says a "watch night" service was held in the Coldwater Methodist Church on December 31, 1899, to welcome the new century. Mr. Jesse Taylor was one of those who made speeches during that service.

Henry H. Taylor and his family have given us much cause for thought, including allowing us to believe one way only to find out much later how mistaken we had been. To start with the Bible records found on this family have never agreed one hundred percent on who his children were. Also most wanted him named Henry Watson Taylor, which disagrees with all the legal records we have found concerning him and/or his estate. All legal documents indicate his name to be Henry H. Taylor. Some of us are of the opinion that his wife Beady may have been a Watson but we can not prove this to be true.

Another item was the inability to find out anything about his second wife which none of the Bible records ever mentioned or any of his descendants ever knew anything about. However court records showed where provisions for a year were given to his widow who was not named. His first wife, Beady, died eight years before Henry did. He died in 1835, however the 1830 census only lists what appears to be his children, no wife.

We have found conflicting Bible records as to the name and number of his children. Both agreed on birth dates but not on first names. From the census records it appears he had eleven or twelve children. At his death his estate was to be divided ten ways. However when the distribution of his property was finally done, it was only divided nine ways no names given.

We know he had a son named Wilson, but we have also come across the name William for one of his sons. We have run across more than one story of one of his sons getting killed by lighting while riding a black horse. However the stories do not agree on which son it was or even in which state the accident occurred.

It is possible that Henry H.'s sons. Jacob and Jesse were both killed or died during the Mexican War. Records prove that Jesse died on January 28, 1848, in Mexico. There is also a Jacob Taylor who died in Mexico on May 5, 1848. This may be Henry H.'s son and it may not be. There is a DeKalb County court record for September, 1848, for a Jacob Taylor to be guardian of Jesse's children. Which Jacob is this? Henry H.'s son or David Taylor, 1779's son since both had a son named Jacob.

The children of David Taylor. b. 1779 and Henry H. Taylor apparently were very close. They interacted in many ways. Many moved to Arkansas and lived in somewhat close proximity to one another. And in DeKalb they served as each others securities and witnesses on various court documents. Because of these and other things, including the common use of Watson for a middle name in both families I've often wondered if David and Henry may have married sisters, daughters of a man named Watson who was probably a neighbor when they all lived in Georgia. (Perhaps Jacob Watson?)

The information I received years ago when I began searching for the Tennessee Taylors on Henry was that Henry H. died in 1835 and that his wife Beady died in 1826. I now assume that these dates came from their tombstones. They were buried near the mouth of Indian Creek in what eventually became known as the Henry Taylor Graveyard. The graves from this cemetery were moved in the 1940'd when Indian Creek was flooded by the completion of Center Hill Dam.

As stated previously we do believe that Henry H. Taylor remarried after the death of his first wife but from census records it appears the marriage must have taken place after the 1830 census was enumerated. On that census there are only three females listed and they are of the ages of his three daughters.

Neal Taylor was going to do some checking on some of John (War of 1812) Taylor's family on the 1850 Dallas County. Missouri Census awhile back. He's not too sure how it happened but he ended up searching the Dade County census instead and what should he find but two of Henry's sons, Farris and Wilson. Needless to say we were both surprised. We knew that Farris had left DeKalb prior to 1850 and that he was in Searcy County, Arkansas, by 1860. Now we know where he was in 1850 and why we were unable to find him before. Farris eventually did move to Searcy County, Arkansas.

Wilson Taylor has been a bit more confusing for us to trace in the past. We found him on some of the early DeKalb County, Tennessee, census records but missed him on the 1850. Then he reappears on the 1860, 1870 and 1880 census records. We knew he had been married but never knew his first wife's name. The 1850 Dade County, Missouri, records show he was married to a Kathryn born in 1806 in Tennessee and that they had at least one

child, a daughter, Mary, born in 1832 or 33 in Tennessee. We knew he had a couple of children born in the mid 1850's which because of Kathryn's age we are tempted to think were by a second wife. And then in 1858 he married Lucy Robinson.

As it has turned out Abraham Perry Taylor has been the most confusing for us to trace. There are those of us who have always believed Abram remained in the Sink Creek area of DeKalb County, Tennessee. We were under the impression he had died and was buried there. We had found where his son Abel C. Taylor of Barren County, Kentucky, had made bond in DeKalb County to become guardian of his younger brothers and sister: James W., Perry G., Isaac, and Mary E.

However a few years back LaVelda Faull did some record searching in Barren County, Kentucky. She found where Abram married Mary A. Rowland Sater Wells on October 18, 1860. She was a forty-five year old twice widowed woman with the following five children: Lucy Sater. George Sater. Fletcher Wells, Nancy Wells, and Lucretia Wells. Her first husband was Jacob Isaiah Sater who died sometime between 1839 and 1841. Her second husband was William A. Wells who died after 1847. It was his brother, James J. Wells who was administrator for Abram's estate.

LaVelda Faull also found an 1863 tax list for Barren County. It stated that A. P. Taylor had no land in Barren County but that his wife, Mary had one hundred sixty acres. They also owned one slave, valued at \$100; four horses at \$20; one mule; eight cows; four hundred bushels of corn; and sixty bushels of wheat.

And also from the Barren County Court records it was learned that Abram had died prior to February 23, 1864, when his estate was probated, administrator was James J. Wellls. It also stated that Wilson Jasper Taylor was to be guardian of James Watson, Perry Green, Isaac Denton, and Mary E. Taylor, his younger brothers and sister.

However it was probably this Jasper Taylor that was killed by lightning while riding the big black horse as his estate was settled on August 15, 1864, just a little more than a year after Abraham had died. Jasper apparently had to have been of good health when his father died to have been appointed his sibling's guardian. The only estate Jasper had at the time of his death was his interest in the estate of his father, A. P. Taylor.

Apparently Abel (Dick) Taylor became the younger children's guardian after Jasper died. Why the bond was made in DeKalb County. Tennessee, when they were all living in Barren County, Kentucky, I don't know.

After Jasper's death and before Abel became their guardian William J. Myers was appointed to be the children's guardian. The children were living with the following families for a time.

James Watson lived with W. T. Bailey from 1864 to 1868. Perry Green lived with Abel Taylor from 1864 to 1867 Isaac and Mary E. lived with William Myers from 1864 to 1867

One of my relatives, Leoda Atnip, send me a few sheets from your books "On the Taylor Trail" and "Taylor Legends". I would like to purchase copies of each. What is the price?

I am a "Atnip" (original name was Im Aebnit) descendant and also a Taylor descendant. My Great-Great Grandparents were Reuben Cane Atnip and Elizabeth Jane Taylor. I have most of their descendants to the present. Much info on Reuben's ancestors, but very little on Elizabeth's side. I started a "Im Aebnit - Atnip Family News" last year. Will be writing about Reuben & Elizabeth in the near future.

I want to share a story with you regarding Elizabeth Jane Taylor because I notice you have written on page 89 of "On the Taylor Trail" that she was referred to as Kizza, Lizzie or Liza. And in one census I found her listed as Keziah (I've have to look it up to see the exact spelling). This census was when she was a young married with small children. And in my cousin, Elizabeth Marcello's "Atnip News' from about 20 yrs ago, she printed she was called Kizzy or Kizzie. Now to the story. Elizabeth Jane Taylor was my Grandmother's Grandmother. And my Grandmother remembered her well. Elizabeth was tall & thin fair skin, blue eyes & red hair. When my Grandmother was a child and Elizabeth would come to visit, my Grandmother, Addie Lee Atnip, and some of her brothers & sisters, would call her Kizzy, then run like the devil was after them. Because it would make Elizabeth MAD!! Addie said they would tease her, because it was something to do. When I asked more questions about it and How they Knew it would make her mad, she couldn't remember that part, only that it made her mad, so it was fun to do; but they would get some distance away before they would do it. I have a feeling that Great-Great Grandmother would roll over in her grave if she knew people were dubbing her "Kizzy" today, or any Somewhere, either someone wrote me or it was in a census record that Elizabeth name that was close! could not read or write. Seems it was in the same census that had her listed as Keziah. So I have my own personal theories about what may have happened, but nothing concrete. But I do know these were not true nicknames that anyone would actually call her in a normal conversation, but would, to tease & aggravate & see her get riled up.

Dear "Cousin" Ardie

I had to laugh when I read your letter. Know just what you mean. Even though it's enjoyable, it's still a lot of work. Don't think a lot of our relatives realize just how much work it is. I need to be financially independant to have the time to devote to my genealogy. So until I win the lotto, I do what I can, when I can.

You certainly may use the story my Grandmother, Addie Lee (Atnip) Crane told me about her Grandmother Elizabeth Jane Taylor. I have enclosed a Pedigree Chart showing my ancestors back to Elizabeth Jane Taylor and her parents. I will look thru some of my info and find the census reports that said she couldn't read and the one where she was listed as Keziah as well as any other info I can find on her. I do not have a picture of her but would love to have one. Do you or any of your readers have one? I do have a picture of one of her sons & his wife, my Great Grand Parents, Abraham Page Atnip & Margaret Emma Clark. Have it on my wall. If you would like a copy I can have copies made.

So far, in 7 generations I have 236 descendants of Elizabeth Jane Taylor, including spouses I have 403. But there are a lot more. Some I have but haven't put in the computer yet. Some I'm still gathering information on. I see you already have their children. One day - after I retire - I'll try putting together a book on the "Atnip" family. So far I have have 1108 descendants of the "Atnip" immigrant from my family line, 1843 including spouses. And many many on another "Atnip" immigrant. The two immigrants are related, but how, I don't know yet. The name "Atnip" is changed from the original spelling. Don't know if you want to mention this in your book or not, but I'll tell you anyway - about the history of the name "Atnip" "Sometime in the 15th Century in central German-speaking Switzerland, a group of disconcerted people left their homeland of Aebnit, in search of a better life. They found their way to the high alp region of Grindelwald where they were welcomed by the local mountain farmers. The locals gave the title of Imabnit to the newcomers, meaning literally from the plains." Im was the German contraction for the word from. Aebnit the German word for plains or flat land. Most people in Switzerland now spell the name Inabnit. After arriving in the colonies, the name has changed. There are probably 20 different spellings of our family name, but all (that I know of) of Elizabeth Jane Taylor and Rueben Kane Atnip's descendants use the spelling Atnip. Something else about Rueben - My Grandmother did not know how his middle name was spelled. She didn't know if it was Cane, Kane or Cain. Most likely he didn't either.

My Great-Grandfather, Abraham Page Atnip (Elizabeth & Rueben's son), could not read or write. I don't know if his brothers and sisters could read and write or not. But Abraham's wife Margaret Emma Clark could read and write. Rueben was a farmer and so was Abraham. Abraham &

Margaret were called "Mama" and "Papa" by their children and I think by all of their grandchildren. When my Mother or Uncles spoke of Mama or Papa, they were talking about their Grandparents, Abraham & Margaret. My Grandmother, Addie Lee Atnip, was called Mother by all her children, grandchildren & great-grandchildren. My children called my Grandmother, "Mother". And her 2nd husband, John Aye Crane, my Grandfather was known as "Father" to all the grandchildren & great-grandchildren.

Well, I've run on & on. Let me know what & how much info you want for your book. Hope it won't be published for a while, it might take me some time to have the time to look up info. The Atnip Newsletter is due out in Nov and again in Feb. Time is short. I work a full time job and also have a bookkeeping & income tax service that I do out of the house. Have a handful of clients that I do their books monthly. But working full time & doing the paper it really is a handful!

Just changed banks on my Im Aebnit - Atnip Family News this week-end to get cheaper monthly charges, and the new checks have not been printed, so I've written one on my bookkeeping account for a copy of your books. Keep me in mind & let me know when your new book comes out.

Esau was a son of Abraham Taylor. She has learned quite a bit about his family and the area where he worked, but where he went is still anybody's guess. I am including a couple of sheets of information she copied concerning Esau. She also compiled a more complete family tree of the family than we have had before. She found Esau on the 1870, 1880, and 1900 censuses of Barren County, Kentucky, but could not locate him on the 1910. Esau worked at a saw mill in Slick Rock.

We have always heard rumors about Esau shooting a man and leaving the area. However in checking all available records in Barren County she was not able to verify this story. What she was able to discover was that the saw mill used to be on the creek at Slick Rock and the village used to be where the old voting place was on the corner by the creek and the Beaver Creek Road.

From LaVelda: "I was told to call Jesse Pickett, about 70 years old, whose father used to work in the saw mill in Slick Rock. I tried to call him but so far haven't had any luck getting someone to answer the phone.

This afternoon I decided to go look at the Slick Rock area. I already knew where the Slick Rock Baptist Church is because I pass it on my way to my mother's house all of the time. It's on Route 68/80, a short distance from the church. Around a corner and down a hill was the turn off called Slick Rock Road. The pavement dips down into a hollow, and immediately you feel a little cut off from the outside world. The road turned sharply to the left and climbed up a hill under a tunnel of trees. At the top of the hill, I came out from under the shady passage and started down into a little valley, passing between two hills on either side. At the bottom of the hill and around a curve, was a cluster of 4 or 5 houses, one of which stood on the conrer of Beaver Creek Road and Slick Rock Road. On the other side of the road, the creek flowed under a bridge. Somewhere in this area the saw mill used to stand. It was very quiet and I didn't see a soul around.

"Finally got hold of Jesse A. Pickett who told me that there was a big flood in 1901 that washed away the whole town of Slick Rock — the churches, schools, livery stable, stores — everything. Only one old school house is still there. If you turn left on the dirt road at the bottom of the hill, the school house is a short distance.

"If the flood washed everything away in 1901, that would explain why everyone left. Joel (Esau's son) may have come back because of his wife's family who lived in Metcalfe County. Joel's son was born in 1905 in Texas. That's probably where they all went."



These roads were only a mile apart and there were no road signs of any kind. Their corn was so very tall it was unreal for us. We grow corn here too but not to the heights that they do.



Much to my delight I received two phone calls in the fall of 1996 from two of Martha's decendants. The first was from Betty Barker Kloeppel. P. O. Box 500082, Malabar, FL 32950-0082. She is a descendant of Frances Terrell who married James Davis. The other was from Dorothy Bearden Heaner, 1007 Beachview, #201, Dallas, TX 75218-3612. She is a descendant of Martha's oldest daughter, Rebecca Terrell, who married Benjamin Head. And in addition. Cliff Hill discovered more information on Martha and William's daughter Martha Terrell which is also included.

We were surprised to learn that Martha Taylor Terrell owned a slave. On the 1860 census Martha is listed living with a female slave, aged about sixty. Martha was in her late seventies at the time and no doubt needed help. Most of William Taylor, Sr.'s descendants were not slave owners.

It was also discovered that Jim Boodis (James B.) Terrell lost an eye during the battle on Kensaw Mountian during the Civil War. Because of this he received a pension of fifty dollars a month for the remainder of his life.

The following is an obituary from the the "Elberton Star", Friday, January 24, 1919, sent to me by Cliff Hill, Jacksonville, North Carolina. Pridie (Sarah Margaret Madden) Terrell was the wife of Jim Boodis and a daughter-in-law of Martha Taylor Terrell.

"DEATH OF SPLENDID ELBERT COUNTY WOMAN"

"Mrs. Pridie Terrell, 78 years old, died last Wednesday and was buried on the following day at Rock Branch church. She had been confined to her bed for the last three months. She was the mother of Mrs. E. A. McGee, and one of the county's oldest and best citizens, beloved by a wide circle of friends."

She was the widow of James B. (Jim Boodis) Terrell, youngest son of William and Martha Taylor Terrell, grandson of William Taylor, Sr. She was normally called Pidy Ann. She died on January 22, 1919.

I must also apologize for the mix up of surnames for the family of Sarah Margaret Terrell and her husband. Elzy McGee that is found on pages 375 and 376 of Legends. Sarah was a daughter of Jim Boodis and Sarah Terrell. For some of her family I listed them as Terrells and others as Taylors. And of course all of them were McGees. 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Frances F. Terrell

Frances F. Terrell, Fanny, was born on October 6, 1808. She died when she was seventy-four years old on December 26, 1882, in Madison County, Florida. She was sixteen when she married nineteen year old Jim Davis in 1824. They lived in Elbert County, Georgia, for a time before moving to Alabama about 1843. They were living in Coosa County when the 1850 census was enumerated. About 1859 they moved to Florida and by 1860 were living in Lafayette County and later in Madison County. Frances died in Madison County in 1882 and is buried there. It is not known when or where Jim Davis died.

The following information on Frances Terrell was compiled by Betty Barker Kloeppel, P. O. Box 500082, Malabar, FL 32950.

James and Frances Davis are found on the Elbert County, Georgia, Census in 1830 with a son and a daughter. From the Coosa County, Alabama, 1850 census record it shows that they stayed in Georgia until 1842 or 43 at which time they moved to Alabama. Their son Aaron was born in Georgia and Robert, born two years later in 1844, was born in Alabama. Their son John, b. 1829, was found on the 1830 census but not on the 1850. On the 1860 census of Lafayette, Florida, he was living next door to his parents.

One of the interesting things about genealogy is the unexpected. We plod along and eventually find a tidbit here and a crumb there. We usually feel pretty good about our finds regardless if they are big or small. And then sometimes something comes along and blows everything away and we stumble back to square one. If this happens after you've published your findings it can be quite embarrssing. Otherwise it just gives you a good laugh. Such is the case with with Martha Ann Terrell.

Sometime after Legends came out I was told she had married twice, first to John Franklin and secondly to Willis Craft. She supposedly had no children with Franklin but did have nine with Willis Craft.

During the winter of 1997 while visiting with Cliff Hill on the telephone I was lamenting the fact we knew so little about Martha Ann. I had just received information on two of her sisters families and was wishing that we had more on Martha and her younger sister Sarah.

Cliff said he had the Craft family and would send me a copy of Martha Terrell Franklin and Willis Craft's family. There was alot of information and I dutifully typed it into my computer. Feeling quite smug, I printed out nine pages of their descendants.

However one Sunday afternoon Cliff called and said I'd best get paper and pencil, we needed to make some changes. He had just been visiting with a Craft researcher who had discovered there were two Martha Terrell Kranklins.

Our Martha Ann Terrell was a daughter of Martha Taylor and William Terrell. She was born in 1811, On July 31, 1831, in Morgan County, Georgia, she had become the wife of John Franklin when she was about twenty years old. We had been of the opinion John Franklin had died soon after their marriage, but he was found on the 1850 census with a second wife, Kathryn, whom he had married in January of 1843. He had had two children with Martha Ann and two with Kathryn. Sometime after this the family moved out 'West' and we do not know anything else about them.

Martha Ann and John had two sons, William born in 1833 and John in 1835. Martha either died when John was born or perhaps a couple of years later, maybe during the birth of a third child. Martha Ann is buried in Morgan County. She was about twenty-five years old when she died.

The Martha Terrell Franklin that married Willis Craft was John Franklin's sister, also born in 1811. The Terrells, Jeremiah and William, and the David Franklin families were friends and neighbors in Elbert County which may explain why this Martha had Terrell as a middle name.

DRURY TAYLOR, SR.

Perhaps the mystery of William Taylor, Sr.'s missing son has finally been solved. Those of you who have plowed through the Legends book and read all the 'appeared' and 'apparently' phrases I have included, are probably tired of those words. However in lieu of definite proof it is all I can say since I refuse to fabricate or make fiction of the Taylor saga.

I know that we are never going to find a record that lists all of William, Sr.'s children and their birth dates. There simply isn't one. And why have we had so much trouble in piecing together a family record of the Taylors that lived in the southern portion of Smith County? There are many reasons but one is that parts of Smith County later became DeKalb and Warren Counties and the Warren County Court House eventually burned. This of course destroyed all legal documents such as wills, land transactions, marriage records and the like. These are the records that we, as tree climbers, find so useful in tracing families.

What we have learned concerning some of these families is from census records and a few court proceedings and records in Smith and DeKalb Counties. Some of us have been researching this family of Taylors for the past twenty-five years. During that time we have learned to spot some traits that give us the idea that certain Taylors do belong to this family and sometimes allow us to tie them in (Correctly I hope!). And this is what we have done in trying to determine which of the many Taylors we have found that may or may not have been William, Sr.'s sons, including this one. I am still of the opinion that the other Taylors we at one time thought may have been his ninth son are still descendants of this family of Taylors. But that is for other Taylor researchers to either prove or disprove.

Drury Taylor was found on the 1820 Smith County, Tennessee, census. We have always believed he was a close up relative of William, Taylor Sr., possibly a nephew. Neal Taylor has always believed he was William, Sr.'s son. I leaned more to his being a brother of David Taylor, b. 1779. But now, based on some new evidence, I feel quite certain that Neal was correct and that Drury was William, Sr.'s son. We still know very little about him or his family. The census records on Drury are confusing and then of course there was more than one Taylor named Drury.

Drury was one of William Taylor, Sr.'s younger sons, being born in 1788. In 1997 LaVelda Faull found a deposition in the Smith County Court House in Tennessee that Drury Taylor signed in 1838. He listed his age on it as 'about fifty years old' at that time.

Drury or Drewry, we have found both spellings, was found living near the other Taylors in Indian Creek on the Smith County census of 1820. He and his wife had three children at that time, two sons and one daughter, all born between the years 1810 and 1820.

The family is again found on the 1830 Smith County census with five more children than on the previous census. In addition to the two sons and one daughter they now had both a son and a daughter who were born between the years 1820 and 1825 plus three young children born after 1825, one son and two daughters. It appears their family would be something like this by 1830:

We lose our deductive ability when we study the 1840 census of DeKalb County, Tennessee, since it shows that Drury Taylor and his wife were living with seventeen children or people. This census does not contain any names nor show family relationships. Not only that his sons, Drury, Jr. and Godfrey M. Taylor, were both married with families of their own and living independently of the Drury, Sr. household according to this census. To account for this many people living in one household one would have to assume that there was another family or two living with Drury. It is posible that the three youngest children, two boys and one girl may have been Drury's since they were born between the years of 1835 and 1840. If Drury's wife were born in 1795 as it appears, she would only have been forty-five by 1840.

Drury Taylor received power of attorney from James Dupree on November 24, 1833 (pages 43 & 44 of the Legends book). Whether this indicated any type of connection between the two families is unknown. Perhaps Drury's wife was a sister or daughter of James Dupree, we have found no records concerning this or any type of explantion why he was granted this power of attorney. It may have been possible that it was some of the Dupree family that was

living with Drury. Since at the present time I have no census records for any Duprees and have no 1850 census for Drury, Sr., it is impossible to even speculate what might have been.

From what can be obtained from the court records it is possible that Drury may have had children, Drury Jr., Godfrey M., Dempsey, and Leonard. What we know about Drury, Jr. and his family is already written in the Trail and Legends books. Until recently all that was known about Godfrey was from the 1830 and 1840 census records plus a little from the court records.

I have made some wrong assumptions in the Legends book, such as the one found on page 44. There I stated that Godfrey M. Taylor must have been born prior to 1812 in order to be old enough to witness a legal transaction. In this day and age I'm sure one must be over twenty-one to be a legal witness. Apparently this was not true in those days. Godfrey was only sixteen at the time he witnessed James C. Dupree's transfer of power of attorney to Drury Taylor in 1833. The other witness was Dempsey Taylor. There was a Dempsey Taylor living in Scott County, Tennessee in 1870 although I rather doubt it was the same one.

There is mention of Dempsey Taylor in other court records, both as a road hand and as a witness for some legal transactions. We don't know what happened to Dempsey after he left Smith or DeKalb Counties.

We are of the opinion that Leonard Taylor was also a son of Drury Taylor due to the fact that he was found as a road hand in court records and always listed with Godfrey and Dempsey. We have never been able to find him on any other records.

As has been mentioned previously, Godfrey M. Taylor was listed as a road hand in DeKalb and Smith counties, a witness to some legal transactions and is found on the 1840 Dekalb Census with a wife and a son.

The 1860 Camden County, Missouri, census lists a Godfred M. Taylor, born 1817 in Tennessee and later still an 1880 Dallas County, Missouri, census record of Fred Taylor, born in 1817 in Tennessee and several members of his family including one for a grandson named Godfrey Taylor, who was born in 1877 in Missouri.

Godfrey and his extended family were living in Miller Township, Dallas County, Missouri, in what could be called a small Taylor community in 1880. Not only was Godfrey and his family there but also Marion Duane Taylor who may have been a younger brother of Godfrey.

In addition to some of Drury Taylor's family living in Miller Township of Dallas County some of his brother John's family was also living here. John Kent Taylor and family were living with this group. He was a son of John T. Taylor, as was Mills Drury Taylor who was living in Jasper Township in Dallas County. John

T. Taylor was the son of John (War of 1812) Taylor and his second wife. Nancy Sweeten.

It was interesting to note that Godfrey also used the common Taylor names of William, Drury, and John which of course left us with the distinct impression he had to be a grandson of William Taylor, Sr. rather than Benjamin Taylor, Jr. as I had originally surmised.

Godfrey had been living in Illinois for a time before 1849 and had moved to Missouri by 1854, dates that coincide with other Taylor migrations. Marion Duane Taylor apparently stayed in Illinois until 1874 at which time he moved to Arkansas. But by 1877 he too was living in Missouri. From some of the early census records of Godfrey we were lead to believe his oldest son was named Evan T. Taylor, born in 1838 in Tennessee. However we again picked him up on the Jefferson County, Missouri, census along with his brother Greenberry or Greenbury, we have found it spelled both ways. On this census record his name was Arvin Taylor, b. 1838 in Tennessee.

The following contains a brief family tree for Godfrey M. Taylor and the offical records that have been found for him and his family.
